Almost 140 years of history and fine elegant style add character to this wonderful listed building. Immerse yourself in the glowing warmth and atmosphere of our spaces designed for entertainment and enjoyment and loved by many generations.



Our Main Hall is the centrepiece of the building, with elements dating back to 1878, including the unique Stephen Adam stained glass on display at the top of our windows. The Halls are a light and airy space with a modern finish adding a beautiful backdrop to your ceremony or reception.



Our Outdoor Courtyard hosts an historic cast iron lamp post with 'Maryhill' imprinted on the crossbar. Where once it would have had a gas lantern it now lights up with a modern bulb as a beautiful beacon!

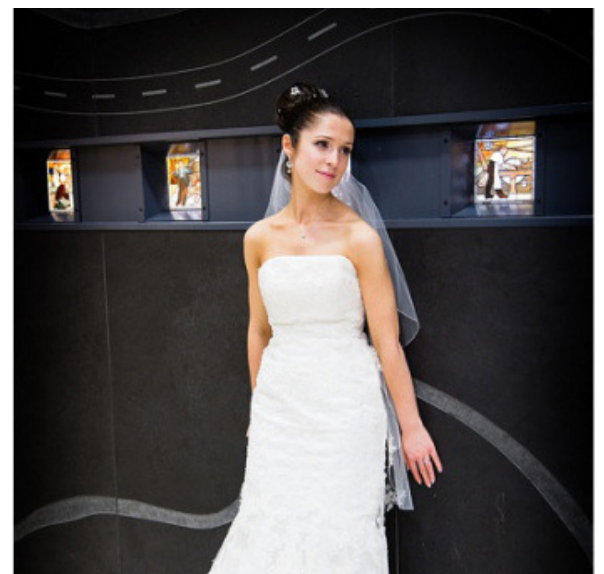


THIS IS YOUR SOMETHING NEW

The Halls were refurbished in 2012, bringing a whole new lease of life to this historical building. This makes it the perfect wedding location, with all the character of an old building, but with the convenience of modern facilities.

Our Main Hall features a full lighting rig, plus a digital projector and large screen to give you the opportunity to play a video or a slideshow of photographs to add that personal touch to your ceremony or reception. We also have a full PA system with microphones for those all-important wedding speeches!

The building is fully accessible, with automatic front doors, wheelchair access throughout, lift access to the upper areas and a hearing loop. There is also an accessible drop-off point at the entrance gates on Gairbraid Avenue, allowing easier access for visitors with limited mobility.

THIS IS YOUR LOCATION



Maryhill Burgh Halls are located at the junction of Maryhill Road and Gairbraid Avenue, just across the road from Maryhill Library.



The new main entrance to the complex is via the archways and the firemen gates leading to the entrance courtyard off Gairbraid Avenue, which we share with the Glasgow Life Maryhill Leisure Centre. Our entrance is on the right hand side of the courtyard.



The new entrance courtyard was once the site of Maryhill Fire Station. The gates which are now at the arches were designed by renowned Scottish sculptor Andy Scott, and depict period firemen with their equipment, providing a striking and memorable celebration of the past, while helping highlight the new entrance to the restored and regenerated Burgh Hall.



THIS IS YOUR LOCATION

Gairbraid Avenue is closed to traffic, so if arriving by car, turn off Maryhill Road at Kelvindale Road, then turn right up Burnhouse Street. Free on street parking is usually available in near vicinity - although please note space outside the Halls itself is very tight, so please only park in the marked bays on Gairbraid Avenue. Six dedicated disabled spaces are available directly opposite the archway entrances.

The nearest mainline station is Maryhill, situated about 20 minutes walk (1 km, 0.6 miles) north of the Halls, straight along Maryhill Road.

The Forth & Clyde Canal provides easy access to Maryhill and Burgh Halls. Access on foot from the canal to the Halls can be found at the top of Burnhouse Street, and there are mooring facilities near the former White House Inn, beside Lock 21. Full details can be found via Scottish Canals.
