

Beaches, walks and days out

Hive Beach – Part of the World Heritage Site by the village of Burton Bradstock, this beach seldom gets too crowded.

West Bay – A lively fishing harbour and perfect base for a stroll along the coast with fantastic cliff top views. Mackerel fishing trips and 'rib' rides are also popular in summer.

Abbotsbury Swannery & Children's Farm -

The only place in the world where you can walk through a colony of nesting Mute Swans. The Children's Farm is a great for under 11's. Here you can feed baby goats, cuddle guinea pigs, ride ponies, and have endless fun.

Golden Cap – This is the highest sea-cliff on the southern coast of England. On a clear day you can see across Lyme Bay to Dartmoor.

Charmouth Fossil Centre – This is a mecca for dinosaur hunters of all ages and experience, with special events arranged throughout the year.

Lyme Regis – Immortalised in 'The French Lieutenant's Woman', the town's harbour wall, The Cobb – is a must see along with sandy beach and fossil shops.

Sherborne – With two castles to choose from, a Medieval abbey, antique shops and cafes, Sherborne is a great place to explore.

Furleigh Estate – The multi-award winning, vineyard is just 3 miles from the hotel. Tours take place on Fridays and Saturdays.
