History of Warwick Castle

The rich and vibrant story of Warwick Castle can be traced through the different ages of stewardship that span over 1,100 years.

Attacked in 1264, besieged in 1642 and damaged by fire in 1871, the Castle has survived the ever-changing fortunes of history. Warwick Castle remained under the stewardship of the Earls of Warwick and later the Greville Family as a private home until 1978. The property was then taken over by The Tussauds Group, which later became Merlin Entertainments Group in 2007 and remains under its guardianship today.

Wedding Breakfasts

Dine in The Cedar Drawing Room nestled in the heart of the State Rooms with its intricate 17th Century cedar panelling. This room was used for holding the most noble of festivities, from grand banquets in the late 17th century to ballroom dancing during the late 19th century.

For a more intimate affair take the opportunity to dine in our opulent State Dining Room. The State Dining Room has played host to an array of historical monarchs including, Queen Victoria and Prince Albert and more recently Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth II.

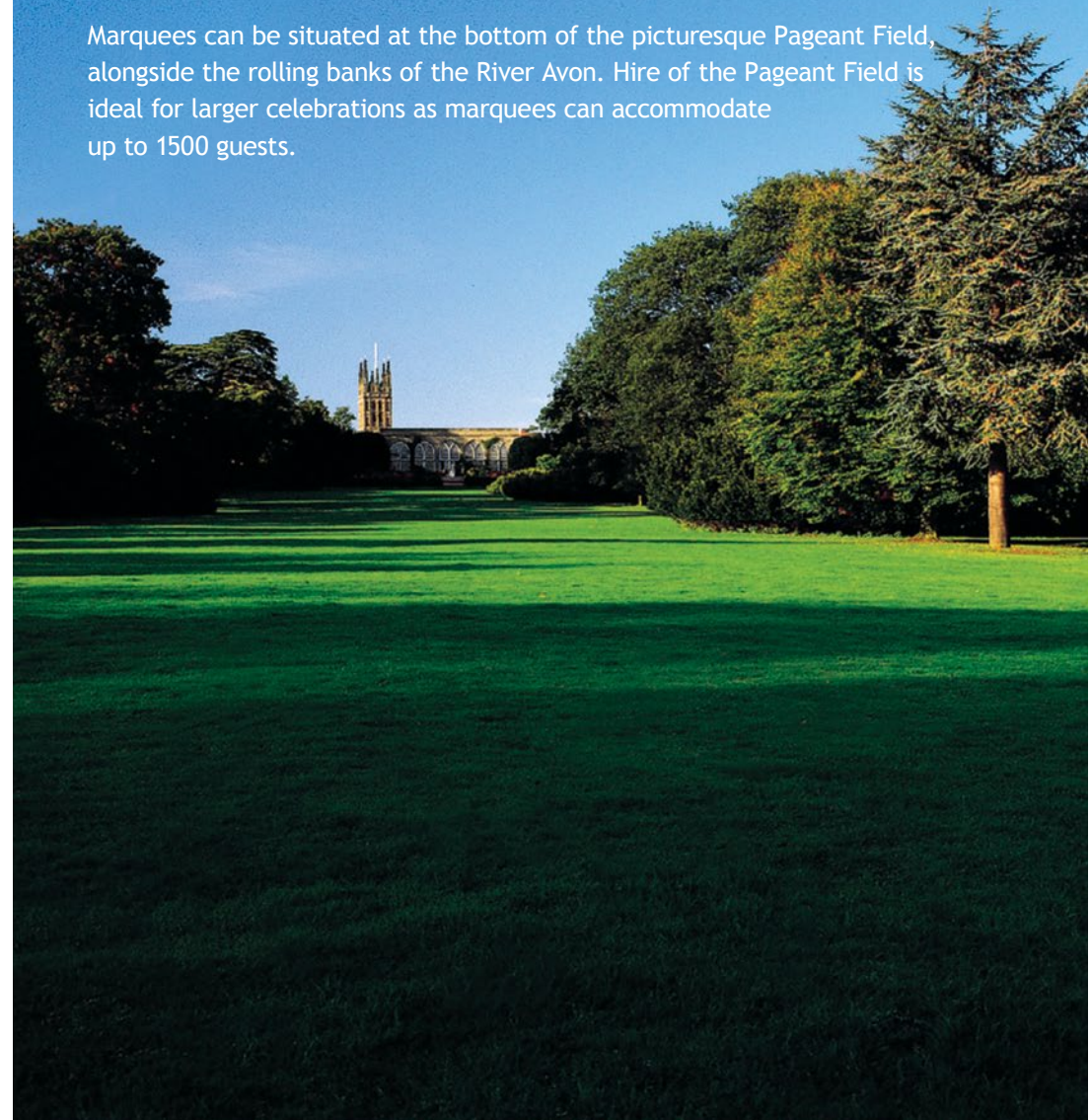


Landscape Grounds

Running gently down to the river is the Pageant Field, flanked on either side by trees, many of which are over 200 years old.

This lawn was laid by Capability Brown to provide a picturesque view of the river Avon and an area for the ladies and gentlemen of the court to parade on sunny days. The perfect setting for outdoor wedding photos.

Marquees can be situated at the bottom of the picturesque Pageant Field, alongside the rolling banks of the River Avon. Hire of the Pageant Field is ideal for larger celebrations as marquees can accommodate up to 1500 guests.

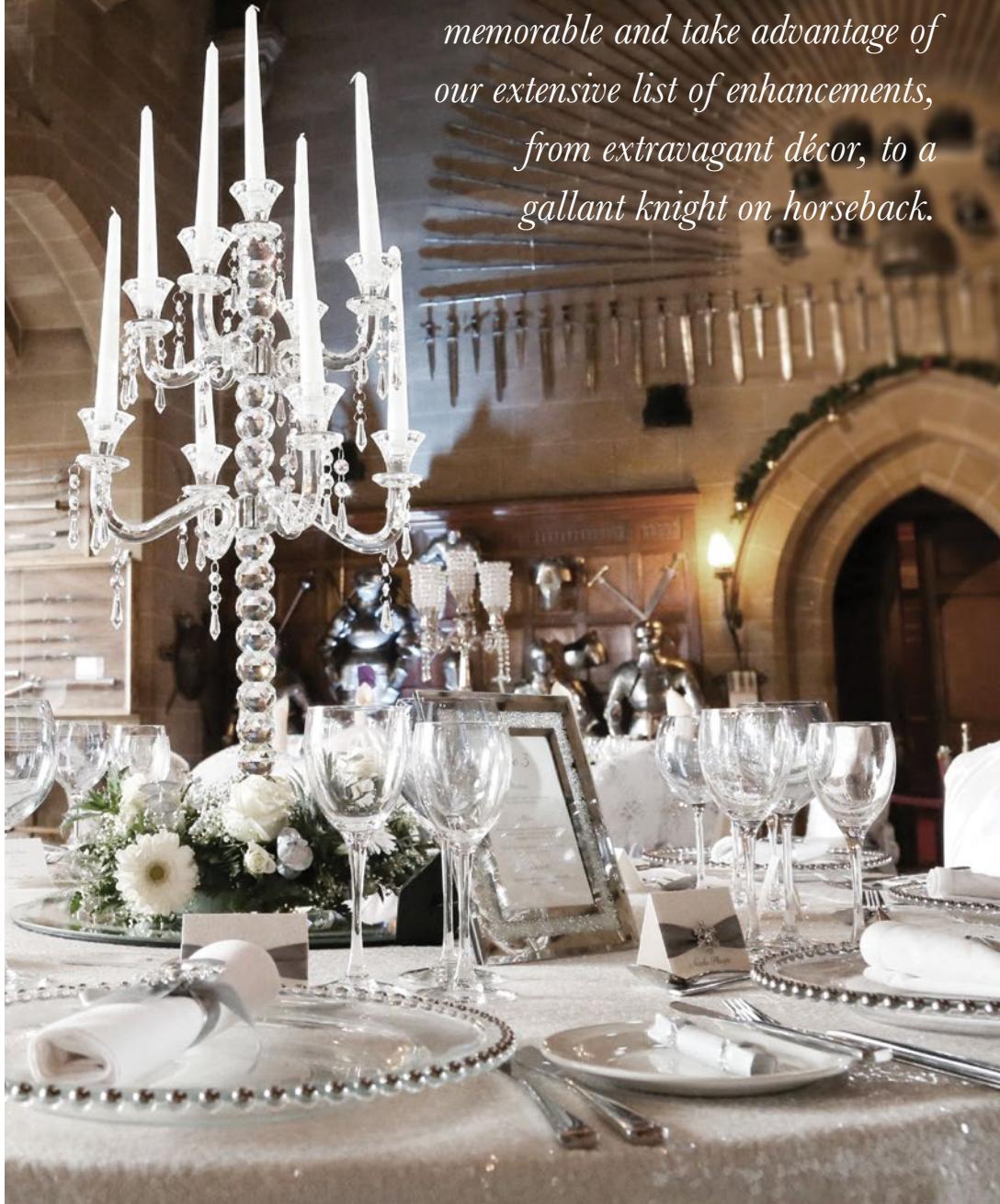

When can civil ceremonies take place?

Civil ceremonies take place from 3pm depending on the time of year in any of our licensed venues.

Who is Warwick Castle licensed with for civil ceremonies?

Viewings of the Castle and the grounds are available by appointment, please call 01926 406 660 to arrange a suitable time. We recommend allowing at least one hour for the viewing.

What are your licensing hours?

The Great Hall

Evening receptions conclude at midnight and guests are to vacate the premises by 12.30am.

The State Dining Room

Evenings conclude at 11pm and guests are to vacate the premises by 11.30pm.

Mediaeval Banquets in the Great Hall and Undercroft

Banquets conclude at 10.30pm and guests are to vacate the premises by 11pm.

Extensions are available upon request and at an additional charge.

Do you allow external caterers on to site?

Should you wish to dry hire the venue and use external caterers, we have an approved list of approved companies that you can choose from.

Will the Castle remain open to daytime visitors?

Yes, the Castle grounds remain open to day time visitors. The Castle closes to the public at varying times depending on the time of year.
